



Grading Scales

- Assessments (Formative/Summative) = 70 %
- Classwork, Homework, & Participation = total of 30 %

*All grading scales are the same between grade level/content teams

Resource teachers have minimum number of grades per quarter. Resource classes will now assign grades (including Code!)

Missing Work

- Missing work must be provided within 3 days of an absence
- Students must turn in make up work within 7 days after receiving make up work

Reassessment-

- Teacher discretion and administrator approval is required
- ► To ensure adequate measures of standards mastery
